A Message from the Superintendent...

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome everybody back for the 2014-15 school year. We extend a warm welcome to all our new students and families and are very pleased to have you with us. It is my hope that everyone had an enjoyable summer. It seems to go by so quickly! This upcoming year, like all others, promises to be both exciting and challenging. We will be faced with new assessments and testing as required by the Ohio Department of Education.

The summer has been a flurry of activity around the building. When you are in the building you will notice new, bright and colorful floor tile and paint in the Middle School. In addition, a majority of the building has been repainted and the gyms both have new color added. We have increased access points for additional technology and added two new mobile labs in the elementary school. Our elementary music room has now become a regular classroom and music will travel from room to room.

The 3rd Reading Grade Guarantee is fully implemented and we are proud to report that none of our students were affected this past year. Students in grades K-3 will be required to be on grade level in reading. Students that struggle will receive intensive intervention and the staff will be diligent in their attempts to get all students on level.

We will be implementing the new teacher evaluation (OTES) that has been mandated by the state legislature. Teachers will now be evaluated on student growth and achievement (student performance) instead of strictly teacher performance. This will be a major shift in evaluations. In addition, we will be in our second year of new principal evaluations (OPES).

The 2013-14 school year was another great year academically. We have received preliminary testing data and we expect to do very well. It appears we have achieved 21 of 24 report card indicators. Our performance index (an accounting of all tests) has increased to 101.9. This is our highest ever! Our High School was named a School of Honor for High Progress and School of Promise. Fairfield High School also had a National Merit Scholarship Finalist in Jessica Francis. She is the only student in our history to achieve this honor.

I would like to welcome to all of our new staff members. We are sure they will be great additions to the staff and help to continue our tradition of excellence. You can find a listing of all new personnel in this edition of the Focus on Fairfield.

This year as in the past we will be utilizing Waiver Days for teacher professional development. We have not received confirmation of dates at this time. If we are approved we will adjust our master calendar to reflect these days. The waiver days allow for teachers to continue to get required and necessary training and in-service so they can best meet the needs of our learners.

Please be sure to check the bus routes and schedules in this addition of Focus on Fairfield. Several routes have changed for this school year.

As always we look forward to working with your student and hope that their school year will be a great success in many ways. Again, welcome back and feel free to call or stop in the office any time you have a question or concern.

NEW FLOOR MACHINES

After the hallway tiling projects were complete, the custodial staff realized that they needed to explore different methods of keeping the tile clean and sanitary.

In an effort to increase efficiency and cost, two ride-on floor machines were purchased this summer. The two Tennant T-7 machines have EC H2O technology which means they use only water - no chemicals. The floors are washed, dried and sanitized completely with one pass. This eliminates the possibility of slips and falls.

The time efficiency of the machines will also reduce labor hours.



Child Find Policy

The Fairfield Local School District's adopted Child Find Policy requires that all children below twenty-two (22) years of age residing within the district, who have a disability regardless of the severity of the disability, and who are in need of special education and related services are identified, located, and evaluated in accordance with all federal regulations and state standards.

For children birth through age two, a disability means that a child has a behavior, cognition, communication, physical development, sensory development and/or social or emotional development deficit.

For children age three through five years of age, a disability means that a child has a documented deficit in one or more of the following areas: communication skills, hearing abilities, motor functioning, social emotional/behavior functioning or vision abilities.

For school-age children, a disability means a person having one or more conditions such as autism, developmental handicap, hearing handicap, multi-handicap, orthopedically and/or other health handicaps, emotional/behavior handicap, specific learning disability, traumatic brain injury or vision handicap.

Elementary Parent Notification

As a recipient of Federal Title 1 funding, Fairfield Elementary is required to notify parents of elementary students of their right to know about the professional qualifications of our elementary teachers. You have the right to know:

- If the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade level and subject areas being taught.
- If the teacher is teaching under a temporary or emergency status in which state qualifications or licensing are waived.
- The teacher's baccalaureate degree major, graduate licensure, and field of discipline
- Whether the student is provided services by paraprofessionals, and, if so, their qualifications.

TRANSPORTATION

~~ ELEMENTARY AFTERNOON DISMISSAL ~~

- ◆ Parents must call prior to 2pm with any changes to transportation, including parent pick-up (unless an emergency).
- ◆ **THERE IS NO INSIDE PICK-UP AT END OF THE DAY.**
- ◆ All students will be dismissed outside to either the bus or parent/guardian.
- ◆ **THERE IS NO LONGER A DRIVE-UP PARENT PICK-UP CIRCLE.**
- ◆ No child will be allowed to enter the parking lot area unattended.
- ◆ Students who are a parent pick-up will be with their teacher in the grass area in front of the kindergarten playground.
- ◆ Parents/guardians should park in the back parking lot and report to the grass area with a photo id.
- ◆ Students being picked up early for afternoon appointments must be signed-out in the elementary office.
- ◆ Students being picked-up prior to 3:25 will be counted as a “leave early” and will reflect on their attendance record.

ELEMENTARY BUS RIDERS - AFTERNOON DROP-OFF

Students in grades K-4 **will not** be dismissed from the bus at the end of the day unless a parent/guardian is present and visible from the bus. Students without someone to receive them will remain on the bus and be returned to the elementary office for parent pick-up.

SCHOOL BUS SAFETY

Parents - please review bus safety with your child.

At the bus stop:

- ◆ Before school - always be on time for the bus. It will not wait for you.
- ◆ Always wait for your bus in a safe place – 20 feet away from a roadway.
- ◆ Don't play around at the bus stop.
- ◆ If you drop something under the bus – LEAVE IT and tell the bus driver or an adult.
- ◆ After school – go directly home. Don't play along the way.

On the bus:

- ◆ Use handrail when boarding.
- ◆ Go directly to your seat - remain seated.
- ◆ Keep aisles and exits clear.
- ◆ Keep head and arms inside the bus.
- ◆ Keep your things in your lap.
- ◆ NO eating or drinking on the bus.
- ◆ Obey and respect the bus driver.
- ◆ Ride quietly.
- ◆ Be respectful to others.
- ◆ No throwing objects in or out of the bus.
- ◆ No bad language.

CHECK YOUR BUS NUMBER & ROUTE TIMES....

If your children ride the bus, please check the schedules on the following pages carefully to ensure they get on the correct bus and are ready at the appropriate time in the morning.
